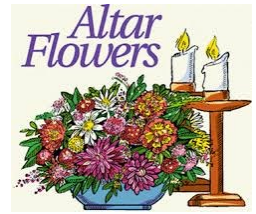
TestTakers starting Winter Classes

Grief and Loss

Grief and loss is something that has or will impact each of us, in one form or another during our lifetime. We experience it in many ways. From the loss of a relationship whether it be from distance, divorce or death, we are affected. Loss of our role when the kids go off to college or leave home. We may experience loss from the impact of someone's addiction, mental illness, a conflict or trust issue in a relationship. Loss due to infertility or miscarriage. Loss of a job, financial security or our professional identity upon retirement. The loss of a home, a community, a feeling of safety or way of life. The loss of our health or the health of someone we care for or a decreased ability to function as we once did. We can even experience loss of hopes and dreams never realized. The list could go on and on.

Often we don't realize or acknowledge the impact our experiences have on us.

- We minimize how much loss affects us, or those around us.
- We can have unrealistic expectations.
- We attempt to intellectualize.
- We impose a time frame of when we should be over something.

We benefit more from compassion when it's the heart that needs healing.

Sometimes our experience and discomfort with grief stems not from our own personal loss, but from the effects of loss of someone we care about and their struggle. It can be difficult to be around someone's

sadness, anger or agitation. It can be extremely uncomfortable and can trigger our own unresolved feelings. We can feel awkward not knowing what to say or do, feeling as though we're responsible to make someone feel better and feeling badly when we can't. We may want to avoid the person grieving not because we don't care about them, but more likely because we don't have the skill set to deal with those emotions and what it triggers in us. Being there for someone in need can mean just that, simply being there. Just sitting quietly in the same room can be enough. Hand holding, giving a hug, a call, a text or card is a reminder that we are not alone and someone cares, which is what we all want to feel.

It is important not to compare; honor all feelings and respect our unique time frame. Grief does not have a time limit and can come and go in waves, but it becomes more tolerable over time. Utilize the support of the safe people available to you, and give grace to those who may disappoint you. Be gentle and kind with yourself and others. Rely on the God who is always available to us, for our God is the true and ultimate healer. God wants to comfort us and wants us to draw close, whether you're going through a difficult season now or perhaps in preparation for when you might. Stay close to God – it's what we're made for and allow God to fill those God-shaped holes.
