A Message from Pastor Bonnie McDougall Olson

Thank you for inviting me to share in your journey as a church—not just once but three times! Now that it is time for me to leave for the third time, I have learned a good many more names and faces and gained a sense of who is who on what committees and which programs. I also remember the pages that were taped on the walls outside the sanctuary in which you wrote out your individual hopes and dreams for GCCC. Big dreams and little dreams. Some new ideas and some reflecting back on successes of the past. While those papers are no longer in the hallways, they are alive in each of you. Dreams for the building up of the church are the work of the Holy Spirit, inspiring and challenging and urging the church forward.

In the parable of the mustard seed, Matthew 13:31-32, Jesus tells the story of a man who "took and planted" a mustard seed in his garden. Despite the size of the seed, it grew to be the largest plant in the garden, becoming a tree that the birds could come and perch in its branches.

I love the story about a missionary in Africa who received a beautiful seashell as a gift from one of her students. The student had walked a long way to the coast of Africa to get the special shell for his teacher.

"You've traveled so far to bring me such a wonderful, beautiful gift," she said. "Oh, teacher," the boy replied, "Long walk, part of gift!"

When I was asked to preach here last summer, providing pulpit supply for Sunday August 11th, I never thought it would turn into such a wonderful journey! That Sunday, as Judi and I caught up with long-time friendships begun 40 years ago, one conversation led to another and before I knew it I was being asked if I would consider helping the church's Search and Call Team on their journey to find a new settled pastor. Since this is my last newsletter article, I wanted to remind you of my mantra, something I discovered when I was an associate pastor here from 1982 to 1986. I first shared this with the confirmation classes which Judi and I led together and ever since I have tried my best to live by these words written by S.H. Payer. I share this gift with you, members, friends and staff of the Garden City Community Church!

Live each day to the fullest. Get the most from each hour, each day, and each age of your life. Then you can look forward with confidence, and back without regrets. Be yourself...but be your best self. Dare to be different and follow your own star. Don't be afraid to be happy...enjoy what is beautiful. Love with all your heart and soul. Believe that those you love, love you. When you are faced with a decision, make that decision as wisely as possible, then forget it. The moment of absolute certainty never arrives And above all, remember that God helps those who help themselves. Act as if everything depended on you. And pray as if everything depended on God. (S.H.
